

The Path – Navigation Guide

The Path 2023 consists of six modules as follows:

Module 1: Name Calling

Module 2: Land and Stories

Module 3: Canada’s Colonial History

Module 4: Contemporary Realities

Module 5: Relationship Building

Module 6: Towards Truth and Reconciliation

Each module is divided into lessons filled with multimedia learning objects and resources. Some modules are longer than others with Module 3 being the longest.

There are Knowledge Assessments at the end of each module. On completion, this grade is automatically transferred to a participant’s personal profile (Grades) on the Learning Management System (LMS).

What appears on your screen may vary over time from the screenshots below as both the interface and Learning Management System versions are updated periodically. Navigation will remain much the same. This Guide will be updated when any significant changes take place.

After creating an account on <https://nvisionthepath.ca/>, locating your version of The Path from the search bar or alphabetical list, and entering the assigned enrolment key, the course opens as shown below.





2. Streamed from NVision – for networks that block Vimeo


Option 1 – Vimeo player

Naawi Oodena

The Kapyong Barracks, located in south Winnipeg, on Treaty 1 territory, was a Canadian Army barracks that opened during World War II and closed in 2004. The Canadian government tried to sell the land without consulting First Nations. The Treaty One First Nations fought to have the land recognized as an urban reserve.

Kapyong Barracks is now known as Naawi Oodena ('centre of the heart and community' in Anishinaabemowin.) and is being developed as a collaborative, parallel jurisdiction endeavour between Treaty One Nation and Canada Lands Company CLC Limited.

It is a 160-acre plot of prime urban land that will house commercial spaces and residential units.


It is the largest urban reserve in Canada and a unique example of reconciliation in action.


