

The Path – Navigation Guide

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Course Modules

The Path consists of six modules as follows:

Module 1: Name Calling

Module 2: Land and Stories

Module 3: Canada's Colonial History

Module 4: Contemporary Realities

Module 5: Relationship Building

Module 6: Towards Truth and Reconciliation

Each module is divided into lessons filled with multimedia learning objects and resources. Some modules are longer than others with Module 3 being the longest.

There are Knowledge Assessments at the end of each module. On completion, this grade is automatically transferred to a participant's personal profile (Grades) on the Learning Management System (LMS).

What appears on your screen may vary over time from the screenshots below as both the interface and Learning Management System versions are updated periodically. Navigation will remain much the same. This Guide will be updated when any significant changes take place.

After creating an account on <https://nvisionthepath.ca/>, locating your version of The Path from the search bar or **alphabetical list**, and entering the assigned enrolment key, the course opens as shown below.

Module Tabs


After completing **Welcome – Start Here**, tabs for all the modules will show. The **Survey, Certificate** tab will appear once at least five modules have been successfully completed, but the Certificate will not be available until all six modules have been successfully completed.


Welcome – Start Here



Click NEXT to continue after the narration has completed on each page.


HELP, GUIDES, SCRIPTS, FAQ

Modules will open with a black screen displaying a play button. Click the play button to begin.



Resume the Module


After exiting, return to the page last accessed by choosing to **Resume**.

Completion Tracking


Completion tracking on subsequent revisits to a module, **before completing the Knowledge Assessment**, will help guide progress as visited pages are shown with check marks.



Returning? Click on module in menu. After the first attempt, this screen will appear to show your status.

EXAMPLE 1
To do: Pass the activity
Grade on first attempt "0%" based on Knowledge Assessments not yet completed.


If **Done: Pass the activity** appears, you know you are finished this module.



EXAMPLE 2
Done: Pass the activity
83% on first attempt. Revisited content three more times.
Completed Knowledge Assessment on attempt 5 with 100%

Note: Once a module has been successfully completed, subsequent revisits treat the module as restarting from the beginning.


Check marks indicate pages visited.




Troubleshooting Page Load

To shorten page load times, browsers cache most of the content that appears on the webpage, saving a copy of the webpage's content on your device. However, cache can also cause issues when viewing new versions of previously visited pages. Deleting the cache and cookies data from your Web browser regularly helps to troubleshoot, increases the loading time of web pages, loads new versions of web pages and increases performance of your computer.

If you have good access to the Internet, the page does not load and you see these three dots, your browser cache needs to be cleared.




If you do not wish to clear your cache, an alternative is to take note of which page you are on, then exit the module, open it again and choose "**Restart**" instead of "Resume". All the check marks will be cleared, but the module will load again and you can continue from where you left off. You may complete the module and complete or repeat the Knowledge Assessment.





It is still advisable to clear your web browser cache, which will also improve browsing of other sites, but until then, the above solution will allow you to continue learning.

There are several videos in each module. All videos have closed captioning and video controls can be found at the bottom of each video player.




Video Play Selection



Although most videos appear in full screen, some shorter videos appear in a smaller player. The video play tools are the same.


Resources

Secondary Menu, Hyperlinks, Scrolling Text, Markers, Hidden Pages

Some topics have secondary pages. Secondary menus can be opened or collapsed.



Some pages have text boxes that can be scrolled to view the full content.

A northern route to the Orient?

Some pages have one or more hyperlinks. Click on each link or image to open a web page. In most cases the page will open in a new browser tab. If it opens in the course tab, use the back arrow to return to the course page.

Click on markers to reveal more information. Most will either play the narration automatically, or offer a speaker button.



Some pages have hyperlinks to hidden pages. In this case the first link changed colour (green), indicating it has been visited. Other sections may include check marks on visited hyperlinks.



Play the hidden page. When the narration ends, it will close, and the main page will appear again. Some pages require all items to be selected. On others, the NEXT button is visible and active.

PREV and NEXT on a hidden page will navigate to menu pages. The PREV button below will not go to the page above, but the page before this one.

Naawi Oodena

The Kapyong Barracks, located in south Winnipeg, on Treaty 1 territory, was a Canadian Army barracks that opened during World War II and closed in 2004. The Canadian government tried to sell the land without consulting First Nations. The Treaty One First Nations fought to have the land recognized as an urban reserve.

Kapyong Barracks is now known as Naawi Oodena ('centre of the heart and community' in Anishinaabemowin.) and is being developed as a collaborative, parallel jurisdiction endeavour between Treaty One Nation and Canada Lands Company CLC Limited.


It is a 160-acre plot of prime urban land that will house commercial spaces and residential units.

It is the largest urban reserve in Canada and a unique example of reconciliation in action.

Each module ends with a Knowledge Assessment.




It is recommended that Knowledge Assessments be completed in one sitting to ensure the grade is properly recorded. Questions are numbered.


On completing a Knowledge Assessment, this screen appears. A grade is recorded for the module in Grades. Didn't pass? Retry Quiz.


Exit Module

It is a good idea to check **Grades** after each module. In the example below, the participant has completed five of six modules.


